Subject: 51st Amendment in University Calendar Vol. II.

In pursuance of the decision taken by the Academic Council vide Item No. A-7 in its 464th meeting held on 18.05.2016, following amendments are made in the University Calendar Vol. II.

Existing Rule 15 (page-10) Chapter-I of University Calendar Vol. II	Amended as Rule 15 (i)
<p>Residential Requirements Residential requirements for all undergraduate programmes of studies shall be eight semesters. The students may be permitted by the Dean concerned four semesters over and above the residential requirements to complete a degree. For this purpose, the students may have to apply for extension in the residential requirements. Extension fee to be charged in case student is not able to complete the degree even after one year of the normal duration is as under:</p> <p>1st Semester Rs. 300/- 2nd Semester Rs. 500/- 3rd Semester Rs. 1500/- and onward, if permitted</p> <p>Such students who fail to complete the programme of studies within the maximum period indicated above, be dropped.</p>	<p>Residential Requirements The residential requirements for all undergraduate programmes (4 years programme) of studies is of eight semesters. The students can be permitted by the Dean concerned four semesters over and above the residential requirements to complete a degree. For this purpose, the students may have to apply for extension in the residential requirements. Extension fee to be charged, in case student is not able to complete the degree within 10 semesters of the normal duration is as under :-</p> <p>11th Semester Rs.300/- 12th Semester Rs.500/-</p> <p>Such students who fail to complete the programme of studies within the maximum period indicate above, be dropped.</p> <p>Ordinarily, no student should be given time beyond the extended period of two years. However, in exceptional circumstances and on the basis of the merits of each case, university may allow a student one more year for completion of the programme alongwith additional fee of Rs.1500/-.</p>


Existing Rule	Added as rule 15 (ii)
-	<p>6 years programme: The residential requirements for all undergraduate programmes (6 years (2+4) programme) of studies is of 12 semesters. The candidate admitted in 6 year (2+4) programme from the Session 2016-17 will not be permitted for admission in the 3rd year unless he/she clears all the courses of first two years in first three academic years, failing which he/she will be dropped from the University permanently. <u>Thereafter, these students of +4 year programme will be treated at par with 4 year programme, in so far as, residential requirements are concerned.</u> (Rule 15 (i) Chapter I of University Calendar Vol. II).</p>

Existing Rule 21.2 (page 61) Chapter-III	Amended								
<p>If a student is unable to complete the programme within the normal residential requirement as indicated in rule 21.1, he/she will be dealt with as under:</p> <p>a) The M.Sc. students should normally complete all requirements for the degree in six semesters from first registration. In case, the student is unable to complete the programme, due to some reason beyond his/her control, the period may be extended by the Dean, PGS on the recommendation of the Advisory committee and the Dean concerned and further on payment of prescribed extension fee up to a maximum of 10 semesters provided he/she has cleared preliminary written and oral examination.</p>	<p>b) The Ph.D. students should normally complete all requirements for the degree in 8 semesters from first registration. In case, the student is unable to complete the programme, due to some reason beyond his/her control, the period may be extended by the Dean, PGS on the recommendation of the Advisory committee and the Dean concerned and further on payment of prescribed extension fee up to a maximum of 10 semesters provided he/she has cleared preliminary written and oral examination.</p>
